
On Hue! Zesty Greens For Pizzazz

It's a new Year and I say YES to vibrant yellow-green hues, for 2017's color of the year—and let's not turn our nose up until we take a closer look at this "greenery". Not as subdued as a delicate, dusty pink and soft, almost periwinkle blue so popular last year but these zesty shades have designers scrambling for all things limey green, and others feeling more comfortable with subtle colors like earthy tones. Whether you're a fan or not, don't be a stick in the mud. Be daring and put some pizzazz in your life.

Make a statement with bigger ticket focal pieces—it just takes one amazing piece to change your space, like a larger-scale painting by [Clifford T. Bailey](#), [George Peebles](#) or [John Sherman](#) who are known for their daring color combinations. Another bold option? Layering several zesty greens like lime-green pieces with a hint of citrus or refreshing blues found at Hunter-Wolff Gallery in smaller paintings, art glass and pottery. Together, their joint intensity will bring balance to your room's overall palette for a big splash of bold.

Still Not Sure? Take a less committal approach with subtle splashes (like in [Jennifer Jung](#)'s landscapes), with a beautifully formed vase, clay platter with crackled glass, or blown glass accent set against a white or cool neutral backdrop like "oatmeal". The result? You get an unexpected surprise of tropical freshness that won't over stimulate.

Give it a try, and let us know how beautiful your room turned out!

Dena Peterson

Hunter-Wolff Gallery is pleased to introduce oil painter [Dena Peterson](#) and her enchanting collection. When asked what she prefers to paint, she almost apologetically admits, “Everything!” She explains, “I likes trying new things and paint what moves me”.


For more than 25 years, she has found that inspiration comes when least expected, like finding a lazy elk grazing in a meadow, or capturing the sun glistening off the worn patina of a church door, or catching a fountain gushing with spring water. What is key for Dena is that it is genuine and speaks to the onlooker without the need for words. “For me, it [painting] is not about duplicating reality. I paint to evoke emotion.”

To further explain, she recalls a time when one of her art professors commented that her work “expresses a love of intimate, quiet, and peaceful spaces”. Whether working *en plein air* or in her studio, she enjoys the rich colors of oil paints and creating texture in her paintings for interest.

Dena is an award-winning artist and has had paintings exhibited in regional, national, and international shows, including the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library in California and Birds in Art at the Leigh Yawkey Woodson Museum in Wisconsin, and national traveling show. Her work hangs in private collections throughout the United States. Public art commissions include The Cherry Tree Heart and Postcards from Loveland, Transformations.

More recently, she returned from five and a half months in Poland where she played an integral part painting for the film “Loving Vincent” to be released initially in the UK. Dena was one of five American artists selected from 5,000 applicants. A total of 150 artists worked on the film which brings the paintings of Vincent Van Gogh to life to tell his remarkable story. Every one of the 62,450 frames of the film is a hand-painted oil painting by professional artists.


Dena joins Hunter-Wolff Gallery this month and we look forward to showing you her current work and new work as soon as it is available.






